The Borough of Highlands is seeking proposals from individuals and/or firms interested in providing planning, design, engineering and grant administration services for the Bay Avenue Streetscaping Project for the Borough. The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Highlands will select one or more individuals and/or firms to provide said services for the Borough. The selected individuals and/or firms shall be based upon a fair and open process, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4, et. seq. and in accordance with the Resolution previously adopted by the Mayor and Council to secure such services through a fair and open process. In order to have a proposal considered by the Mayor and Council an interested individual/firm must provide evidence that they satisfy the minimum requirements for this position, as set forth in Section 3 of this document and that they otherwise comply with the proposal requirements set forth in the Borough of Highlands's NOTICE AND SOLICITATION OF PROPOSALS section of the Borough's web site (www.highlandsnj.com).

SECTION 1 – BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

1.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Highlands, NJ, located in eastern Monmouth County, had a 2012 estimated population of 5,050. Overlooking the Shrewsbury River and Sandy Hook Bay, Highlands sits just above sea level. Bisected by NJ Route 36 into lower Highlands and upper Highlands, the Borough contains 0.64 square miles. Most of its commercial businesses lie in 2 areas along Bay Avenue. The primary business district is on Bay Avenue between Shrewsbury Avenue and Valley Avenue, a smaller business district is centered at Bay Avenue and Waterwitch Ave. Bay Avenue also includes residences, light industrial, office and service commercial. There are over 15 vacant storefronts in both sections. Historically, the downtown has been undifferentiated from other blocks of Bay Avenue.

The Borough of Highlands seeking technical and cost proposals from qualified professional engineering, planning, and landscape architecture consultants for planning, design, engineering, permitting, grant administration and construction inspection/monitoring services for the Bay Avenue Streetscape Project. The Borough has received notice from the New Jersey Economic Development Authority that it is receiving approximately \$1,463,000 in federal Community Development Block Grant funds for Disaster Recovery. Approximately \$248,000 is estimated as costs related to project delivery, construction and engineering oversight and permitting. The federal Affirmative Action goal for minority participation for this project is 60% and the goal for female participation is 6.9%. The project, including construction, must be completed and closed out by December 31, 2015. Proposals should include detailed scopes and schedules that clearly identify deliverables, review periods and scope items that are optional (with their associated costs). The Borough is requesting consultant's assistance in identifying cost-saving opportunities.

1.1 PURPOSE AND INTENT OF REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

The purpose of the project is to prepare for the Borough of Highlands a design for streetscape improvements along portions of Bay Avenue, Water Witch Avenue and Shore Drive, assist in the selection of lowest responsible bidder, acquire required permits, inspect and monitor construction, and administer the CDBG grant. The Borough intends to hire a professional engineering, planning, and landscape architecture firm who will provide the technical assistance to complete this work.

1.2 CONTENTS OF THE PROPOSAL

This project – placemaking in Highlands through the design and implementation of a downtown streetscape – will capitalize on the distinctiveness and the uniqueness of place that is Highlands. It will replace old and cracked sidewalks and curbs, install pedestrian-scale street lights, install appropriate street trees, install bike racks, create well defined crosswalks, and install street furniture such as benches and trash receptacles. All of the proposed improvements are located in commercially zoned areas.

There are 2 commercial areas in the borough that are funded for streetscape improvements. The first is along Bay Avenue, generally from Shrewsbury Ave. to Valley Ave. The construction cost for this area is estimated to be \$606,000.00 (excluding permitting). The second is along Bay Ave. from Washington St. to Central Ave., along Water

Witch Ave from Bay Ave. to Shore Dr., and along Shore Dr. near Water Witch Ave. The construction cost for this area is estimated to be \$608,700.00 (excluding permitting).

Bay Ave. and Water Witch Ave. are both under the jurisdiction of Monmouth County, and coordinating with Monmouth County will be required.

The proposal to prepare a streetscape design for the Borough shall incorporate the tasks and deliverables listed in Section 2.0 Scope of Work. All contract deliverables must be completed within a six (6) month contract term.

Any awards made through the EDA Streetscape Revitalization Grant program will be subject to the Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) regulations and the New Jersey DCA CDBG-DR Action Plan, as approved by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

1.3 COLLABORATIONS AND SUBCONTRACTS

Any proposal that relies on collaboration between consultants, who are not formally affiliated, must include a signed copy of the agreement between the authorized signatories of the parties to the proposal. Any subcontractors to be engaged by the entity preparing the proposal must be identified in the proposal.

SECTION 2 SCOPE AND FEES

2.0 SCOPE OF WORK

The proposal to prepare a streetscape design, construction inspection and monitoring, and grant administration shall incorporate the tasks listed below and the deliverables listed below. The Plan and all contract deliverables must be completed within a six (6) month time frame.

Task A. Project Coordination

The consultant will undertake initial project organization, including a kick-off meeting with Borough representatives, and provide a schedule with relevant tasks, deliverables and dates.

Task B. Project Tasks

1. The selected professional consultant shall develop design plans for the "Bay Avenue Streetscape Project" in coordination and consultation with Borough officials using all applicable federal and state standards and guidelines, including the NJDOT's Roadway Design Manual, NJDOT's Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities Design Guidelines, the Americans with Disabilities Act Access Guide (ADAAG), the

American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) design standards, the National Association of Borough Transportation Officials (NACTO) Urban Street Design Guide and Urban Bikeway Design Guide, the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), and Highlands Intra Borough Bicycle Plan.

- 2. The consultant shall work closely with the Borough officials for the duration of this project.
- 3. The consultant shall meet with Borough officials and the Monmouth County engineer on a monthly basis during the design phase of this project and prepare and distribute meeting notes for the same.
- 4. The consultant shall analyze, evaluate and field check the existing conditions of each intersection and each street segment adjoining the respective intersection. A basemap shall be created for the project area, and all relevant existing conditions shall be mapped for the entire project area.
- 5. For each intersection, the consultant shall conduct a topographic survey and sufficient soil testing to determine drainage patterns as necessary to guide the most effective green infrastructure solutions and design of ADA ramps.
- 6. The consultant shall analyze, evaluate and field check the existing condition of each catch basin to make sure each inlet is "bicycle friendly" and complies with N.J. stormwater management regulations. Those inlets which are non-compliant shall be included for replacement.

- 7. The consultant shall analyze, evaluate and field check each street corner to make sure that each handicapped accessible ramp complies with ADA design standards. Those existing ADA curb ramps that do not comply with such standards shall be redesigned to comply.
- 8. The consultant shall design traffic calming pedestrian safety upgrades for all intersections, including high-visibility crosswalks and stop-for-pedestrian signs,
- 9. The consultant shall produce engineering construction drawings and striping plans for the length of the corridor and each intersection extending 50' beyond the curbline to the north and south. The drawing shall include all proposed improvements, including but not limited to intersection improvements, street tree improvements, banners, and street furniture, and all bicycle facilities in conformance with Highlands Intra Borough Bicycle Plan (available on the Borough's website), current Borough standards, and the NACTO Urban Bikeway Design Guide.

 10. The consultant shall furnish all preliminary and final plans, specifications, cost estimates and project delivery schedules for review and approval by Borough officials in print, PDF, and editable format (i.e. Word, Excel, CAD format).
- 11. The consultant shall assist the Borough prepare bid documents and shall provide bid tabulations and analysis to recommend the lowest responsible bidder for contract award.
- 12. The consultant shall perform all construction administration, inspection and monitoring services.
- 13. The consultant shall complete all state and federal paperwork and reports to facilitate the successful completion of the project for reimbursement to the Borough.
- 14. The consultant shall begin work immediately after award of contract by Borough Council.

TASK C: Meetings

This project envisions significant public input as part of the design process. In addition, the meetings phase will include at least six (6) meetings with the Borough.

TASK D: Monthly Reporting to NJ Economic Development Authority.

The consultant will submit monthly reports to the NJ Economic Development Authority pursuant to its requirements and provide the appropriate documentation to comply with the state regulations for the grant award.

4.0 SELECTION OF CONSULTANT

All proposals will be reviewed by a Review Committee consisting of borough elected officials and staff.

4.1 SELECTION CRITERIA

The selection criteria to be used in awarding a contract for the services described herein shall include:

- 1. Qualifications of the individuals who will perform the tasks and the amounts of the respective participation;
- 2. Experience in providing the planning, design, engineering, construction inspection and monitoring, and grant administration services requested by the Borough and references related thereto;
- 3. Ability to perform the tasks in a timely fashion, including staffing and familiarity with the subject matter and Borough;
- 4. Fee amount;
- 5. Thoroughness and completeness of the applicant's submittal;

The proposal selected by the Borough will be subject to the acceptance of a mutually agreeable contract. The Borough reserves the right to award a contract to undertake all or a portion of the tasks outlined above or to reject all proposals.

Proposals are being solicited through a fair and open process in accordance with N.J.S.A co. 19:44A-20.2 et seq. and as such, Contractors are exempt from the limitations on making political contributions under that law. Exhibit A of the model Instructions to Bidders and Statutory Requirements is the current and complete mandatory language for goods and services (including professional services) bid specifications and contracts. Section VII-A-1 of the Instructions summarizes the requirements and refers bidders to the full text.

The document is the mandatory language for goods and services bid specifications and contracts pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:27-3.4, and the mandatory bid specification and contract language for employment goal compliance for goods and services at N.J.A.C. 17:27-3.6. A complete review of both rule provisions is recommended.

Please note that Exhibit A does not apply to construction contracts. There is a different document, Exhibit B, for such contracts.

GOODS, PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AND GENERAL SERVICE CONTRACTS

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq., as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.
